## BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

May 15, 2017

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2017 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Scott Steager, Max Birkel, Gregory A. Janak, and David Potter.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The following correction to the Board Proceedings from May 1, 2017 was presented. The board voted to purchase a 2018 Western Star 4700 SF from Wick's Sterling Trucks, Inc. for \$91,938.00. A pusher was added to the truck, the amount being \$6,000.00. The total purchase price is \$97,938.00.

- (3) LPA accepts ownership of the Bridge and Culvert Object Markers.
- (4) County agrees to, at its own cost, protect and maintain the Bridge and Culvert Markers in proper condition and in working order. In the event that the traffic control devices are lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed, LPA shall be responsible for replacing or repairing the traffic control devices at LPA's sole costs.
- (5) LPA shall be responsible for meeting all environmental commitments during and after the Bridge and Culvert Object Marker installation on the project.

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WHEREAS, Butler County, Nebraska (“Butler County”) provides a public safety answering point (“PSAP”) which receives 911 service calls and either dispatches emergency services or relays calls to the appropriate public service agency, and

WHEREAS, the Nebraska Public Service Commission, pursuant to the Enhanced Wireless 911 Services Act, has set a surcharge to be collected by wireless carriers and paid by their wireless customers to help fund certain costs of E-911 Wireless, and

WHEREAS, Butler County did not spend the required 25% of its allocation during the 2014-2015 fiscal year. The Public Service Commission is now allowing PSAP’s to use the remaining amount they should have spent and apply it to their personnel expenses.
