

BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

June 19, 2017

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 19th day of June, 2017 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Scott Steager, Gregory Janak, and David Potter. Absent: Max Birkel.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared that the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way Request

A permit to construct utilities on county right-of-way was submitted by Eagle Communication to install fiber cable between Rising City and Highway 15 south of Schuyler. Food Bank of Lincoln

Representatives of the Food Bank of Lincoln appeared before the board to share information on the 16 county area that they serve. In 2016, 76,505 pounds of food, or 63,754 meals, were distributed in Butler County via the Food Bank of Lincoln's efforts. They reported an estimated 900 out of 8,256 people (10.9%) who live in Butler County are food insecure. The food bank conducts monthly mobile food distributions at the David City Auditorium.

Veterans Service Committee

Donald Prochaska, Chairman of the Veterans Service Committee appeared before the board to discuss the salary for the Veterans Service Officer. Dean Kriz, Veterans Service Officer will be retiring and the committee is in the process of seeking an individual to fill that position. It was discussed that the salary will be set at an hourly rate. The budget for the 2017-2018 fiscal year will need to reflect additional costs associated with the training and certification of the new officer. It was the consensus of the board to approve the hourly rate to be set at \$20.19.

Floodplain Issue

Robin Sullivan, Floodplain Administrator and Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent appeared before the board to relay information on the proposed entrance driveway at the Butler County Landfill. The proposed site is located in a designated floodplain area. Information was relayed to the Board by the Floodplain Administrator as to the requirements to comply with the Floodplain Ordinance. The Floodplain Administrator has also been in contact with representatives of the Butler County Landfill.

Award Bids for Gravel, Culverts, and Steel

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent recommended that the board accept all gravel bids, taking into consideration price, proximity, and availability. Moved by Steager, seconded by Krafka to accept all gravel bids based on proximity and price. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Steager, Krafka, Slama, Potter, Janak, and Mach. WHEREAS, Butler County receives a portion of the surcharge funds from the Nebraska Public Service Commission, and is allowed to save or set aside up to 75% of the funds received for future equipment/software purchases and upgrades, and

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year 2015-2016 all funds received were deposited into the 911 Wireless Service Fund,

WHEREAS, Butler County is allowed to set aside funds in the amount of \$7,849.72, amount remaining from fiscal year 2015-2016 for future equipment/software purchases and upgrades.
