March 18, 2019

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 18th day of March, 2019 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, Max Birkel, Scott Steager, Greg Janak, and Anthony Whitmore.

Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. Discussion on Time Clocks

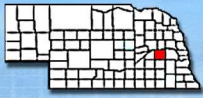

There being no further business to come before the board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 1:40 p.m.

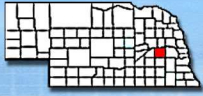

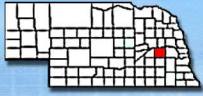

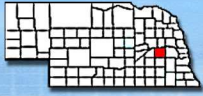
