A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 19th day of April, 2021 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: Scott Steager, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, Anthony Whitmore, David Mach, Robert Coufal and Ryan Svoboda.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021 – 09**

WHEREAS, Butler County, Nebraska (“Butler County”) has or will incur significant expenses relating to the COVID-19 Pandemic: and

WHEREAS, that Butler County, Nebraska will receive federal money as a result of the American Rescue Plan Act; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the establishment of a new COVID American Rescue Plan Fund should be established to allow the County to track expenses and receipts related to the American Rescue Plan Act that have been received and spent per the guidelines set by the United States Treasury.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Butler County Board of Supervisors, that the Butler County COVID American Rescue Plan Fund, Fund Number 2580, is hereby established and approved. The fund shall consist of all emergency relief money received by the County, including but not limited to federal and state aid and any donations received by the County for pandemic relief. The fund shall be used for payment of approved expenses per the American Rescue Plan Act and the federal guidelines that have been set in place for these funds. All moneys received and expended from the COVID American Rescue Plan Fund shall be properly documented.

Discussion/Possible action – Approval of Fence Bids

Randy Isham, Interim Highway Superintendent, presented before the board 2 bids for a fence around the Hwy 92 building.

1. American Fence Company – \$36,535.00
2. NoSwett Fence & Decks – \$41,594.10

Moved by Krafka and seconded by Mach to approve the bid from American Fence Company in the amount of \$36,535. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Krafka, Bauer, Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, and Steager. The following voted nay: Whitmore. Motion carried.

Discussion/Possible action regarding a review and possible change of County Gravel Policy

Whitmore stated that he has been contacted by several of the townships in his district requesting more gravel on the roads and an increase to the 44 yards per mail route mile that is currently in the gravel policy. Isham reported that to increase the gravel budget to include 66 yards per mail route mile would increase his gravel budget \$165,455 using current year numbers. He also noted that there isn't enough money in the current budget to put 44 yards per mail route mile, which also means there is not enough money in the budget for 186 county miles that also need gravel. The board decided to wait to decide on a gravel policy change until they were able to hear from the townships who are on the agenda after the roads update.

Update on Roads

Isham updated that the Linwood bridge is almost backfilled. They have been cleaning ditches in Alexis Township and are moving south to Summit township. He has 2 scrapers at the pit currently trying to get the area prepped for pumping and then he will move the machines elsewhere to keep working on the ditches and roads. He updated that Polk County will be working on getting bids for culverts and then they will work to get a date set for the project. He mentioned they are still working towards a plan for the A Rd bridge that would also be a shared project with Polk County.

Jim Rerucha and various townships – Requesting more gravel in the budget for roads

Jim Rerucha and several other township representatives appeared before the board to discuss the gravel policy and the need for more gravel per mail route mile and non-mail route miles. The board asked if they would increase the gravel policy to 66 yards per mail route mile, would that be satisfactory for them. The consensus was that it would be a good start that would need to be reviewed annually. Steager asked the townships if it would be easier if they also changed the allotment dates to follow the budget year, instead of calendar year. That was also agreed upon that it would be easier to budget for in the future.



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Discussion/Possible action regarding a review and possible change of County Gravel Policy

Moved by Whitmore and seconded by Coufal to change the gravel policy from 44 yards per mail route mile to 66 yards per mail route mile and to change the gravel allotment from calendar year to fiscal year beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Whitmore, Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka, Bauer, and Steager. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

At 10:27 a.m. the chairman declared the board would take a quick break.

At 10:32 a.m. the board reconvened.

Discussion/Possible action regarding Applied Connective quote for Email Security, Endpoint Security and User Training

Moved by Mach and seconded by Svoboda to enter an executive session to discuss Applied Connective's quote for Email Security, Endpoint Security and User Training and inviting Ed Knott, Applied Connective and all elected officials at 10:35 a.m. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, and Steager. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

Moved by Bauer and seconded by Mach to exit the executive session at 11:01 a.m. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Bauer, Whitmore, Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka and Steager. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

Moved by Whitmore and seconded by Bauer to accept Applied Connective's recommendation to add Iron Scales Email Security for \$221 per month to their monthly contract. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Whitmore, Bauer, Krafka, Svoboda, Coufal, Mach, and Steager. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

Discussion regarding an incident with a deputy sheriff

Roy Harris, a Butler County Resident, appeared before the board to inform the board of an incident in which a deputy had pulled his gun on him. He expressed his unhappiness in the way that the Sheriff had handled the situation and wanted the board to be aware of the situation. He thanked the board for their time and exited the meeting.

Discussion to answer questions the Board may have about the Landfill

Ryan Boyer and his associate Clint appeared before the board to answer any questions they may have about the Landfill. It was asked if the landfill is planning to re-apply for expansion; Boyer answered that they can re-apply in 2022 and that is currently the intent. They appeared today before the board to start an open line of communication to see what they can improve upon to hopefully ensure that their expansion application is successful this next time around.

Discussion/Action regarding hiring Highway Superintendent

Randy Isham, Interim Highway Superintendent, discussed with the board the salary for the position and what he could expect once he gets his license. The board said that the salary posted with the job description was \$60,000 per year and that they could re-evaluate wages upon completion of the Class A license. After further discussion Isham accepted the position as Highway Superintendent for Butler County.

At 11:42 a.m. the chairman declared the board would take a quick break.

At 11:46 a.m. the board reconvened.

Discussion/Possible Action – Approval of Memorandum of Understanding between Butler County and Linwood Fire District No. 8 regarding communications tower

Whitmore stated he had requested County Attorney, Julie Reiter, to draw up this agreement per the request of Emergency Manager, Mark Doehling regarding the Linwood Communications Tower. This memorandum explains what Butler County has agreed to regarding erecting the tower and then the future expenses are the responsibility of Linwood Fire District No. 8. Moved by Bauer and seconded by Coufal to approve the memorandum of understanding between



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Butler County and Linwood Fire District No. 8 regarding the communications tower. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Bauer, Whitmore, Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka, and Steager. The following voted aye: NONE. Motion carried.

Human Resources Update

Whitmore reported in Heidi Loges absence, that the time clock in Bellwood has connectivity issues and an antenna will need to be purchased to improve the connectivity issues.

Claims

Steager brought to the board's attention the claims for Steager Lawn Service and the potential for either future equipment purchases for Buildings and grounds to remove the snow; or the possible need to subcontract out the service, he explained to the board it would be a decision made by them, however, he would abstain.

Other claims that were questions were the postage machine repair, it was explained that the previous postage machine did not have a maintenance agreement and it needed to be repaired before the new lease was signed and new equipment installed. Also questioned was mileage for an employee that has a vehicle provided by the county, it was questioned as to why that employee would drive their personal vehicle instead of the county vehicle, it was determined the liaison for that department would speak with the employee and a letter would be drawn up to give the employee the option to drive the county vehicle or their own; however, they could not put in for a mileage reimbursement if they choose to take their personal vehicle. The final claim that was questioned was the replacement of one water heater and the need for another one in the future.

Moved by Mach and seconded by Whitmore to approve the claims except for the Steager Lawn Service LLC claims. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Mach, Whitmore, Bauer, Krafka, Svoboda, Coufal, and Steager. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

Moved by Mach and seconded by Whitmore to pay the Steager Lawn Service LLC claims. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Mach, Whitmore, Bauer, Krafka, Svoboda, and Coufal. The following voted nay: NONE. Abstained: Steager. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

Bauer updated the board that another property has come up for sale in Rising City; however, the property is being sold as a bundle, the land, and a contract to build a building, the asking price at this time for the 3-lot parcel is \$97,000. He said he is informing the board to see if there is any interest.

Svoboda reported that he has attended a couple Region V meetings.

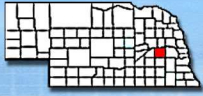
1. Blue Valley Community Action agenda for Tuesday, April 20, 2021
